Juneteenth (short for "June Nineteenth") marks the day when federal troops arrived in <u>Galveston</u>, <u>Texas</u> in 1865 to take control of the state and ensure that all enslaved people be freed. The troops' arrival came a full two and a half years after the signing of the <u>Emancipation Proclamation</u>. Juneteenth honors the end to slavery in the United States and is considered the longest-running African American holiday.
